



Things You Should Know?

- When authorized signs are placed, erected or installed giving notice that parking is prohibited, or the curbing has been painted yellow in lieu of such signs, no person shall park a vehicle at any time on any of the streets so posted or painted.
- The City of Sanford provides 657 on-street parking spaces. 370 of those spaces have some form of restrictions: timed, loading zones, and handicapped spaces. 287 spaces have no time restrictions and can be parked in all day. Please call the DSI office if you would like to know where free on-street parking is located.
- 323 of the 370 spaces are restricted to two hours. 2 are restricted to 1 hour. 14 are restricted to 30 minutes. 4 are restricted to 15 minutes. 5 are restricted as loading zones.
- For time restricted spaces, authorized signs have been erected giving notice that parking is prohibited at certain times or for no longer than certain periods of time
- What is the Citation Rate for a Time Zone Violation: \$25.00
- No person shall park or leave standing a vehicle in any parking space there during such prohibited time or for longer than the permitted period of time. In addition, no one shall move a vehicle from one parking space directly to an adjacent parking space in the same street or directly back into the same space, as that shall be deemed to be one continuous parking period.
- The City of Sanford also provides 4 public parking lots (see map on the back) for the general public to use consisting of 144 spaces. These are free to the public and can be parked in all day.
- How long can I park in a loading zone? Loading zones are designated only for load-

ing and unloading a vehicle. Vehicles parked for any extended period of time may be deemed to be using the space for long term parking and could be subject to a ticket violation.

- There are a total of 18 on-street restricted handicapped spaces. There are 6 handicapped spaces in the public parking lots.
- In no case shall a vehicle remain backed up to curb, except when actually loading or unloading a vehicle. If a property owner knows that construction will be occurring at their building which requires loading and unloading, please call the DSI office.
- It shall be unlawful to park between the hours of 4:30 a.m. and 6:30 a.m. on Mondays and Fridays in downtown Sanford where posted for the purposes of street cleaning.
- No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle, in any of the following places: 1) On any sidewalk, 2) Within an intersection, 3) In front of a driveway, 4) On a crosswalk, 5) Within 15 feet in either direction of the entrance to a hotel, theater, hospital or sanatorium, or any public building, 6) In any public alley or way of travel so as to block or prevent other traffic from passing thereon, except as may be necessary while actually loading or unloading, 7) Upon any public vehicular area designated as a fire lane.
- Any vehicle parked or stopped in violation of the sections above may be towed to a place of safekeeping, and the owner, operator or other person claiming the vehicle shall pay a reasonable charge for such towing before the vehicle is released.
